Be mindful of doors and windows!

Install door sweeps on exterior doors and repair damaged screens. Remember, mice can fit through holes the size of a dime, so it's important to block any potential entrances!

Seal those cracks!

Seal cracks and holes on the outside of the home, including areas where utilities and pipes enter the home, using caulk, copper mesh, or a combination of both.




Sorry Santa! Some rodents can find their way into vents and chimneys, so consider putting wire screens on the exterior openings.

Be smart about food storage.

Store food and pantry ingredients in durable, airtight containers, and dispose of food waste regularly.

Don't forget about the small spaces.

Keep attics, basements, and crawl spaces well ventilated and dry.




Basic exclusion techniques to keep out rats and mice





Keep it dry!

Pests love moist, warm areas around the home. Eliminate all moisture sites, including leaking pipes and clogged drains that provide the perfect breeding site for pests.



Check and Inspect.

Inspect items such as boxes, grocery bags and other packages brought into the home. When setting up seasonal decorations, consider unpacking them outdoors.
